Can the percentages be removed or replaced with something else in the Student Progress Report with Standards?

Percentages can be removed but it also removes the bar. You have some display options for the Progress Report:

- Show Overall Grade (*this was checked on the example I sent you*)
- Show Points (*this was checked on the example I sent you*)
- Show Bar (*this was checked on the example I sent you*)
- Show Areas with No Results
- Show Assignment Detail
- Show Standards Detail (*this was checked on the example I sent you*)
- Request Signature
- Show Category Breakdown
- Show Class Average
- Show Assignment % of Overall Score

I saw an element called "Report Card Items" in the Gradebook Score Entry with Standards screen that mentioned Report Card Correlations. Can we correlate standards to reporting categories (standard domain/cluster) to make the report card less cumbersome? If so, can we allow teachers to grade on individual standards and/or the report card categories to which the correlate (choice)?

My understanding of Report Card Correlation is that it is only available for Elementary level where every student in the same grade receives the same report card with same standards. I will add it to my list of questions for the Synergy Gradebook trainer to see how this works for secondary teachers using standard based Gradebook with final grades calculated based on standards.

Is there a Parent Vue with Class Standards Summary?

There isn't an overall summary by course at the secondary level but they can see the standards at the assignment level.

Any luck with our ability to redefine the Assignment Types into two tiers?

I have been told that the decision has been made to go with the "out of the box" features of Synergy for this first year.

Email notes to Eavi (02/15/2013):

Standards Proficiency Analysis

- Delete **Mean** option
- Leave **Power Law, Highest Score, Last Score, Median**
- Add **No Analysis** option (per conversation with Jim)
- Have **No Analysis** be the default option.

Score Types

- Erin is creating district default options (most likely 5 options), and send these to Eavi
- Do **not** lock down at district level/ Allow teachers to create additional options

Grade Scale

- Question: Can we have multiple district default options?
- If so, we would like these to match the Score Types (except **Raw Score/Points**)
- If not, we will need to discuss further to select the district default.
- We have not made a decision about locking this at the district level yet.

Parent Vue

- Only display Letter Grade and Standards information
- Do **not** display percentages used to calculate Letter Grade

Assignment Comments

- Delete **Extra Credit** and **Language**
- Keep **Late, Absent, Missing, Incomplete**
- We may add more
- Lock down at district level

Assignment Categories

- Rename **Normal**, as **For Grading**
- Delete **Extra Credit**
- Keep **Not For Grading**

Assignment Types

- Would like to see two levels of Assignment Types.
- Level/Tier 1: **Formative** and **Summative**
 - Locked at district level
 - Required for all assignments
 - Ability to be weighted for grading
 - Ability to change for individual students per assignment (*i.e., the same assignment could be Formative for most students, but switched to Summative for select students who have demonstrated mastery*)
- Level/Tier 2: **Practice, Assignment, Project, Assessment** as district defaults
 - Open for teachers to make additions
 - Ability to be weighted for grading
 - Not required

Report Card Comments

- These are in the translation phase and should be done by Friday, February 22, 2013

Mark Definitions

- Courses that earn “H” and “M” designations as a default will be indicated on the course spreadsheet (Erin).
- Teachers can select “M” designation in all general education courses. Default should only be “M” if designated as such.
- Teachers can select “H” designation in courses marked as “Honors Option Available” on the course spreadsheet. Default should not be “H” designation for these courses.
- All courses that can earn “H” and “M” designations will have this option for all letter grades (A-H, B-H, C-H, D-H, F-H/A-M, B-M, C-M, D-M, F-M).

Course length

- All high school course lengths will remain “18 weeks” for the 2013-2014 school year.

Menu Slimming

- Matt Smith, Travis Reiman, and I would like to attend a demo of the Gradebook with Eavi and Jane after the above changes are made.
- At this time we would like to discuss the slimming down of menu options for ease of use.

PD Plan

- Erin is developing written documentation of terminology and features above that convey shared definitions, best practices, and possible applications.
