Matt and Travis,

The excel document attached has the revised PD budget for what Middle School and High School Principals asked for during the last operations meeting. (Look at the "Level" column to determine MS or HS. Yellow highlights for subject area totals; while the bottom of the page shows overall totals and just middle school and high school.)

You'll notice it is still well over \$18,000. We can eliminate subject areas/courses, change the scope of the work, or be content with less quality and reduce the time spent with each, to trim the budget.
